

1987 - first national helpline for children and adolescents



Telefono Azzurro & the www

"Navigando nel cyberspazio", 1999 (with Education Sciences Dept. - Bologna University): containing guidelines for minors' safer navigation

Conferences:

- "Sexual abuse on children and adolescents: from low to interventions" (2000)
- "Children between old and new media" (2001)
- Annual Report about Children and Adolescents Conditions: reports on Internet child-pronography and low #269/98 against webbased pornography
- Self-regulatory code "Internet and minors" by Ministry of Communications

EU Safer Internet Action Plan

- against illegal and harmful content on the Internet
- Three main action lines:
 - Creating a safer environment through promotion of hotlines, encouragement of self-regulation and codes of conduct
 - Developing filtering and rating systems, facilitation of international agreement on rating systems.
 - Awareness/ Making parents, teachers and childr POESIA the potential of the Internet and its drawbacks, overall coordination and exchange of experience

Safeborders/what

Awareness campaigns:

- addressing perceived shortage of information regarding the safety of minors in the Internet
- empowering parents, teachers, children, consumers and other relevant target groups
- Production/ distribution of clear, concise and easy-tounderstand on-line and off-line information and awareness material, designed according to each target group's needs.
- Co-operation through national (sub)networks, which will allow increased visibility/awareness and wider coverage

Safer Internet Day (Feb. 6th)

- celebration of children's right to a safer Internet
- remind people that it is the responsibility of all sectors in society to get involved together in order to guarantee this right
- Germany, Greece, Italy, Luxembourg, The Netherlands, Spain, UK
- Italy/Telefono Azzurro:
 - Schools
 - Intitutions/Government

114 - public children emergency hotline/1

- hotline for emergency or immediate danger related to psychological and physical safety of children and adolescents
- agreement between Telefono Azzurro and three Italian Ministries: Communications, Equal Opportunities and Employment and Social
- public emergency service accessible from wired line
- managed by Telefono Azzurro
- completely free of charge



114 - public children emergency hotline/2

- <u>also</u> notifications regarding:
 - websites, chatlines, newsgroups or pedopornographic material on the Internet
 - TV programmes or advertisements that could be harmful to the children's psychological and physical development or that can bring uneasiness to the children
 - 114 e-mail address available for these notifications
- archiving for analysis

Access-point for reporting emergencies:

- file integration into the unique database + mail notification to call-centre
- handling:
 - the best action plan to be evaluated
 - identification of competent authorities/bodies and notification
 - forwarding of information with most suitable mean (mail, fax, other)

- guidelines for teachers and parents about how to ensure safe navigation for children and teenagers
- ⇒ list of key-features making web sites more or less convenient for youngster
